## PREVIEW

### Historic European Aquatics Championship Première in Romania

- Six-day-competition in Otopeni with numerous top athletes – 399 swimmers from 40 federations
- “Local hero” David Popovici is the biggest hope of host Romania – New champions in 22 events

Otopeni, Romania (EA) – Fast turns – exciting atmosphere – it’s time for some short-course action in the 25m-pool: And after the last edition in Kazan/Russia in 2021, it’s time for another première. Otopeni, only a few kilometres away from the capital Bucharest, will host the first ever European Aquatics Championships on senior level in Romania. From December 5 to 10, many of the top swimmers of the “old continent” will meet at the 22<sup>nd</sup> European Short-Course Swimming Championships.

And after the Romanian Swimming and Modern Pentathlon Federation secured its first ever European Short Course gold in 2021 (David Popovici, 200m freestyle) the next medals shall surely follow in the first week of December.

The top European short-course event, which will celebrate its 26<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year (including the four editions of the European Sprint Swimming Championships from 1991 until 1994), had its première more than a quarter-century ago in Rostock, Germany in 1996. In 2021 it was turned into a six-day event.

The extension of the five-day meet allowed the addition of two new events: 2021 in Kazan the first European titles in the men’s 800m freestyle and the women’s 1500m freestyle were awarded. Since Chartres in 2012, when the mixed 4x50m free and medley relays were introduced, this was the first addition to the schedule. In Otopeni, altogether 42 events will be staged – 36 individual and 6 relay titles will be on offer.

#### Swimming popstar Popovici aims for a medal at his home event – Szabo, Toussaint & Co want to retain titles

The hopes of host Romania are totally focused on their new swimming hero David Popovici. To defend his 200m freestyle title in front of a home-crowd will be really exciting for the youngster, who added four gold medals at World (2) and European (2) long-course Championships to his tally since 2021. At the 2022 Junior Europeans in Otopeni the then-19-year-old native from Bucharest won three more gold medals in his “home-pool”.

Other champions aiming to defend their 2021 titles are Hungarian Szabolcs Szabo (50 free, 50/100 fly), Dutch backstroker Kira Toussaint (50/100/200 back), Italians Martina Carraro (100 breast), Alberto Razzetti (200 fly), Nicolo Martinenghi (100 breast) and Greek Andreas Vazaios (200 IM). Anastasia Kirpichnikova also hopes to defend her Kazan titles (400/800/1500m freestyle). With one difference – since April 2023 the native Russian, who represented Russia until 2021, will now compete for France and will thus be part of the French team in Otopeni.

#### New title-holders in 22 events – Next-gen swimmers “ready to rumble” – GB and Italy with big teams

The swimming year is drawing to an end in Otopeni and many of the top swimmers are already preparing for the upcoming World Championships in Doha (February 2 to 18, 2024) as well as for next year’s ultimate highlight, the Olympic Games in Paris (July 26 to August 11, 2024).

For many others, especially the next-gen swimmers, Otopeni will offer the opportunity to (im)prove their short-course skills and maybe step into the limelight for the first time. Due to the absence of some 2021 title-holders like Sarah Sjöström from Sweden, Italian Gregorio Paltrinieri or Florian Wellbrock from Germany as well as the swimmers of Russia and Belarus, new champions in a total of 22 individual events will be awarded.

40 of the altogether 52 LEN Member Federations have entered athletes for the 42 competitions, 399 swimmers (222 male / 177 female) in total. Sure enough, swimmers from France, Great Britain and Italy can be expected to be among the medallists. All three nations will send big teams with illustrious names – they aim to step into Russia's footprints, that topped the medal tables at the previous three editions in Copenhagen (2017), Glasgow (2019) and Kazan (2021).

Great Britain (35 athletes) and Italy (31) will arrive with the largest teams ahead of Sweden (23), the Netherlands (20), France (19) and Hungary (18). The team of host Romania with a total of 21 swimmers is headed by the 100m freestyle LC World record holder Popovici while backstroke specialist and 2021 European silver medallist (100m back) Robert Glinta finished his long and successful career.

### **Top stars participating in Otopeni – Swimming youngsters pushing into the limelight**

International top stars in Otopeni will be, among others, Kira Toussaint and Arno Kamminga from the Netherlands, Austria's Felix Auboeck, the Italian cracks Nicolo Martinenghi, Alessandro Miressi and Simona Quadarella, Hungary's Szebasztian Szabo and Zsuzsanna Jakabos, Lithuania's Danas Rapsys, Greek Andreas Vazaios and Apostolos Christou, Norwegian Henrik Christiansen, Swedish sisters Louise and Sophie Hansson, Angelina Koehler as well as veteran Marco Koch from Germany and Ukrainian Mykhailo Romanchuk.

British Swimming didn't send a team to Kazan in 2021. This time round, it celebrates its comeback with some medal contenders such as Matthew Richards, Duncan Scott, Tom Dean, James Guy, Kathleen Dawson or Freya Anderson. The French sprinters Maxime Grousset (24) and all-time-“classic” Florent Manaudou (33), who have already had a hot duel at their national championships, as well as their team-mate Beryl Gastaldello would also like to have a say in the medal awarding.

With Daniel Wiffen, a brand-new face stepped onto the big stage last year. In December 2022 at the Irish Winter Championships, the 22-year-old swam the fourth-fastest time in history in the 800m freestyle (7:25.96), thus turning into the first Irishman to hold a European record. And, although all three 2021 medallists on the 800 and 1500m freestyle (Paltrinieri, Wellbrock, Sven Schwarz) will be missing, swimming fans can well expect thrilling battles with Wiffen, Norwegian Christiansen, Mykhailo Romanchuk from Ukraine as well as the French trio David Aubry, Logan Fontaine and Damien Joly fighting for the medals.

Other youngsters which will surely find their way onto the podium are Ellen Walshe (22), the U23-European champion (200/400 IM) from Ireland, Estonian breaststroker Eleni Jefimova (16) or Lana Pudar (17), who won the first ever European gold medal for Bosnia and Herzegovina in Rome 2022 (200 fly). Pudar also left a lasting impression at the recent World Junior Championships in Netanya 2023 when she claimed two gold (100/200 fly) and one silver medal (50 fly).

The youngest athletes in Otopeni are Daria-Mariuca Silisteau (born 10/03/2009) from Romania and Lajdi Allaraj (born 18/02/2009) from Albania, both 14 years old. The oldest participant is Finland's Ari-Pekka Liukkonen at age 34 (born 09/02/1989), followed by 34-year old Hungarian Zsuzsanna Jakabos (born 03/04/1989), Germany's Marco Koch (33) and French swimmer Florent Manaudou (33).

### **Prize money: €300,000 for the top performers**

The European Aquatics (EA) increased the prize money offered for the athletes in 2021. Beforehand, the top 12 individual performances among men and women were rewarded €220,000 respectively. The LEN Bureau decided to expand the list to 15 and now the prize money pot amounts to €300,000.

For the fourth time in the history of European Short-Course Championships, World and European records will also be rewarded with a bonus. Each individual World record, set up in the Otopeni pool, will earn €10,000 for the athletes, while each individual European record brings €5,000 (senior records only).

## FACTS & FIGURES ...

**... DATE and VENUE:** From December 5-10, the Aquatics Complex of Otopeni, just a 15km distance away from the Romanian capital Bucharest (with a population of nearly 1.7 million the largest city of Romania), will host the 22<sup>nd</sup> edition of the European Short-Course Swimming Championships. For the second time after 2021, the event will last six days, starting with the first competitions on Tuesday (December 5) and finishing on Sunday (December 10). Bucharest has hosted several big sports events in the past, among them the 2012 UEFA Euro League Final.

**... LOCATION:** The 2023 continental showcase will take place at the Aquatics Complex of Otopeni [www.complexnatatvieotopeni.ro](http://www.complexnatatvieotopeni.ro). The newly built complex, inaugurated in May 2021, already hosted the European Junior Championships in July 2022 with local star David Popovici winning the titles in 50/100/200m freestyle (and the Men's U20 World Championships in water polo last June). With a built-up area of 20,153.33 square meters, the Otopeni Swimming Sports Complex is the largest swimming centre in Romania. The complex can host national and international swimming, water polo as well as artistic swimming competitions, but it is also the perfect place for swimming fans and families to spend their free time, enjoying a splash. The facilities of the Complex include: 6 pools, saunas, offices, VIP areas, massage rooms, conference rooms, sports broadcast area, 6-m high jumping training room, locker rooms, etc. The complex further includes two Olympic-size swimming pools (25x50m) and an Olympic diving pool (21x35m). The total capacity amounts to 3.494 seats, incl. 2797 seats for spectators.

**... LEN / European Aquatics:** The “Ligue Européenne de Natation” was founded on August 30, 1927 in Bologna (ITA) by 11 countries and their national swimming federations, one year after the first European Championships in Swimming, Diving and Water Polo had been held in Budapest. Today LEN, recently renamed into European Aquatics, has 52 member federations from Albania to Ukraine.

**... HISTORY:** The European Short-Course Swimming Championships celebrated its première in 1996. The first event was held in Rostock, Germany. Until today 21 editions were carried out, from 1998 until 2013 it was staged annually. In 2013 LEN switched to a two-year-modus. The last edition took place in Kazan / Russia in November 2021.

**... HOSTS:** The Romanian Aquatics and Modern Pentathlon Federation – together with the National Agency of Sports and the City Council of Otopeni Town – will host the first ever European Aquatics Championships on senior level in Romania. At European Short-Course Championships Romanians have claimed a total of 13 medals (1 gold, 4 silver, 8 bronze) at the previous 21 editions since 1996. Shooting star David Popovici won the first ever gold medal at the 2021 Short-Course Europeans in Kazan.

**... Host II:** Camelia Potec, President of the Romanian Aquatics and Modern Pentathlon Federation, is by far the most famous name among Romanian athletes. She claimed Olympic gold in the 200m freestyle final at the 2004 Games in Athens, Greece ahead of Italian Federica Pellegrini and French Solenne Figues. The multiple medallist at World and European Championships achieved four European long-course titles (3 singles 200/400free, 1 relay) between 1999 and 2004. In 2013 the four-time Olympian was elected as President of the Romanian Swimming and Modern Pentathlon Federation. 2016 Camelia Potec was elected Vice President of the Romanian Olympic Committee.

**... PARTICIPATION:** 399 swimmers (222 male / 177 female) from 40 LEN Member Federations have announced their participation for Otopeni. The record participation at Short-Course Europeans was achieved in 2019, when Glasgow/Great Britain welcomed 49 participating nations.

**... TITLES:** A total of 42 titles will be awarded in Otopeni – including the mixed relay events (4x50m freestyle mixed and 4x50m medley mixed) which were included to the competition programme in Chartres 2012 for the first time. The men's 800m freestyle as well as the women's 1500m freestyle celebrated their première in 2021 at the Championships in Kazan.

**... COMPETITION MODUS:** Heats will be carried out in ten lanes. Semi-finals (only in 50 and 100 metres events), and finals will be held in eight lanes. Qualifiers for the finals will be the top two ranked in each semi-final together with the four fastest times from the remaining swimmers in the semis. In individual events a maximum of four (4) entries per Federation and per event may be submitted (800m and 1500m are excepted). Notwithstanding times and places achieved in the heats, only the two (2) fastest swimmers of each Federation may proceed to the finals or semi-finals.

As a result of the new six-day event, there are some other changes since 2021. Until 2019, the semi-finals and the final in the 50m events were held in the same session (semis at the beginning of the session, the respective final at the end). Since Kazan 2021, the 50m finals will be carried out on the following day. As the event programme is drawn apart, this new schedule offers new possibilities to some swimmers.

**... MIXED RELAYS:** At short-course events, the 4x50m freestyle and 4x50m medley are part of the programme. A mixed relay team will consist of two male and two female swimmers who can start in whatever order. The first European mixed relay events in long course (4x100m freestyle, 4x100m medley) took place at the 2014 European Championships in Berlin.

**... MEDALS:** In the history of the Championships – from 1996 in Rostock/Germany until 2021 in Kazan – a total number of 2451 medals in gold (827), silver (805) and bronze (819) have been awarded to 35 national federations. With a total of 324 medals Germany is at the top of the all-time medal table, ahead of Russia (245) and Italy (242). Last federation to be listed on the medal table for the first time was Liechtenstein in 2017 (Julia Hassler, bronze, 400m freestyle).

**... PRIZE MONEY:** Since the 2017 Short-Course Europeans, European Aquatics (LEN) offers a bonus for individual World (€10,000) and European records (€5,000). In total, EA (LEN) distributes 300,000 Euros for the top 15 performances (both among the men and women) according to the FINA points table as follows (one swimmer is rewarded for his/her top performance only). Additionally, LEN offers financial assistance to all LEN Member Federations.
